

# Energy independence mexico



## Overview

---

Mexico's strategy to regain energy sovereignty focuses on two main projects: the Dos Bocas (Olmeca) and Deer Park refineries. These projects increase domestic refining capacity, decrease fuel imports, and protect the economy from global price fluctuations. Mexico has announced a proposed series of reforms to its energy sector. Historically linked to oil self-sufficiency and the robust institutional framework of state-owned enterprises, the concept of energy sovereignty is facing structural challenges that could. In Mexico, after 6 years of the current ideology, several changes on the Energy sector are taking place. These changes are impacting the definition and mechanisms where private companies can participate within both the Power (including Generation and Supply) and Oil (Exploration and Exploitation). On Nov. 6, 2024, President Claudia Sheinbaum's administration announced the National Strategy for the Electric Sector for 2024–30, which presents a critical crossroads for Mexico.
